6 December 2020

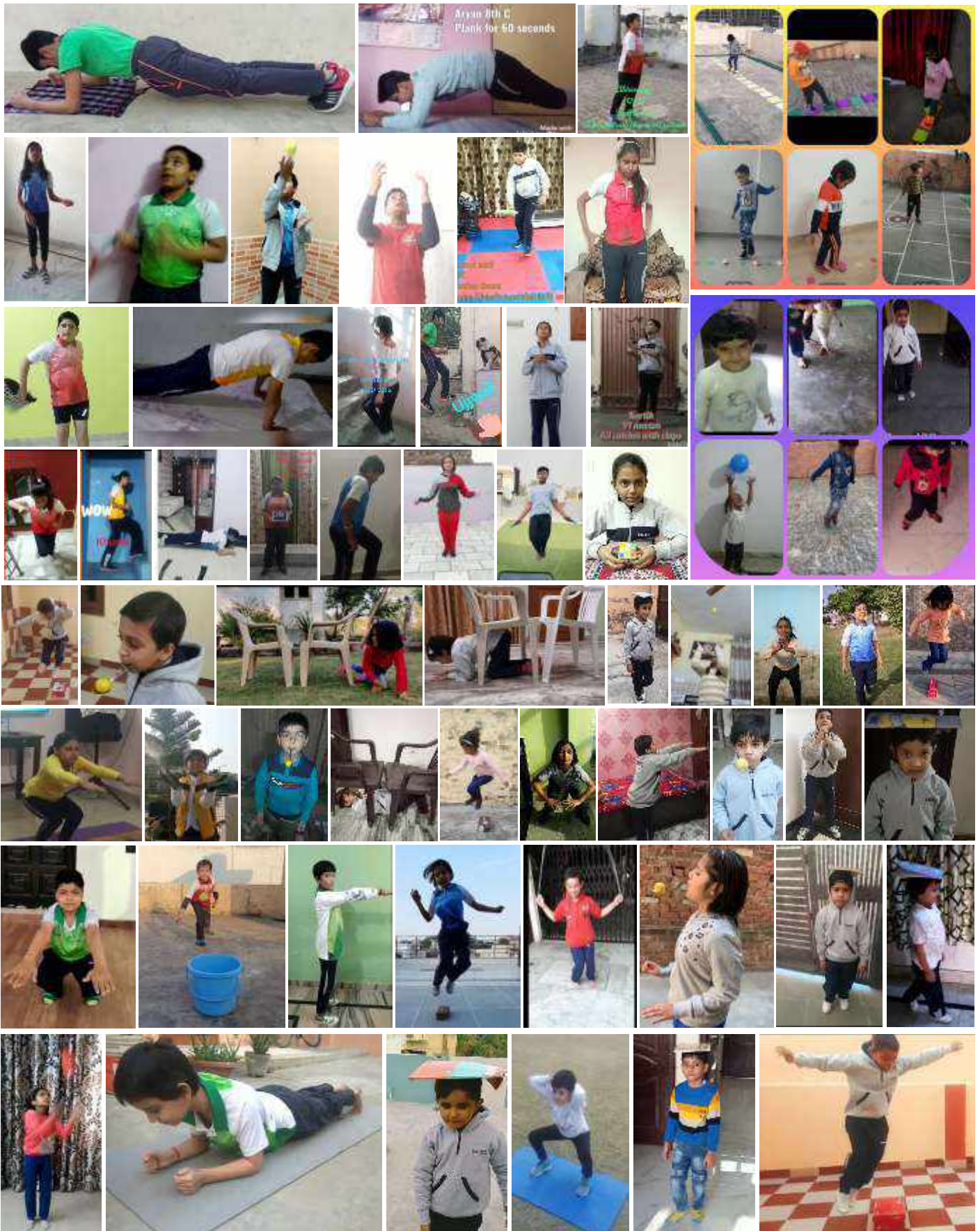

# Diwali Celebration

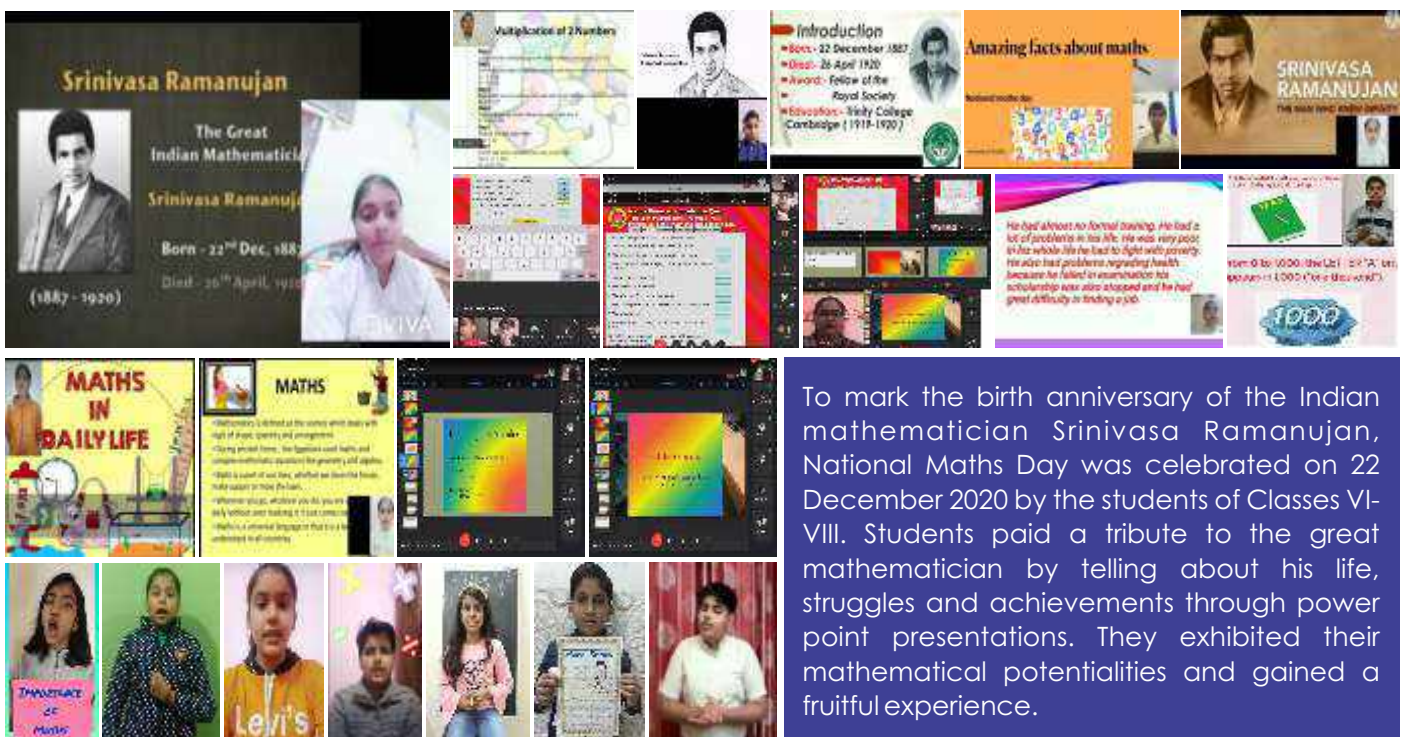
5 November 2020

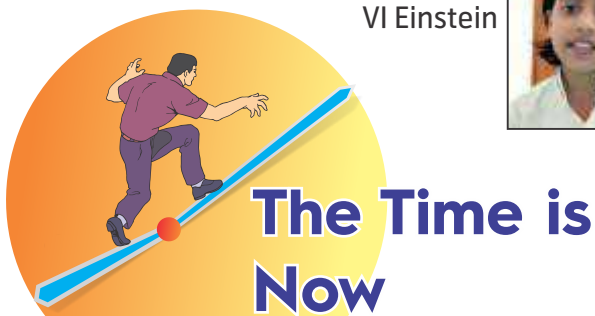

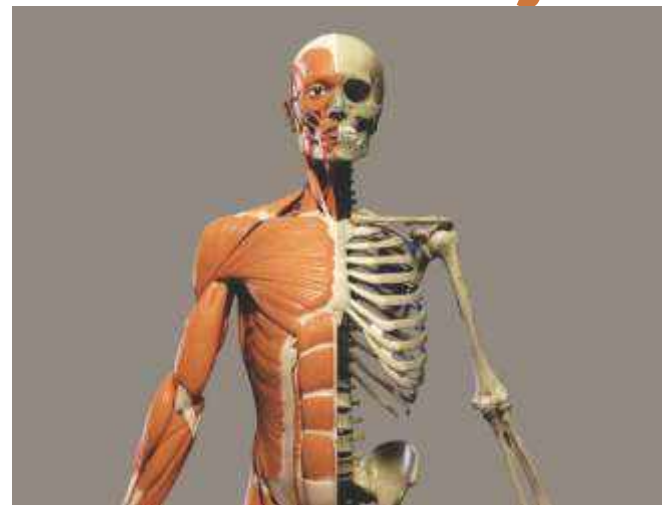

# Virtual Maths Museum Activity

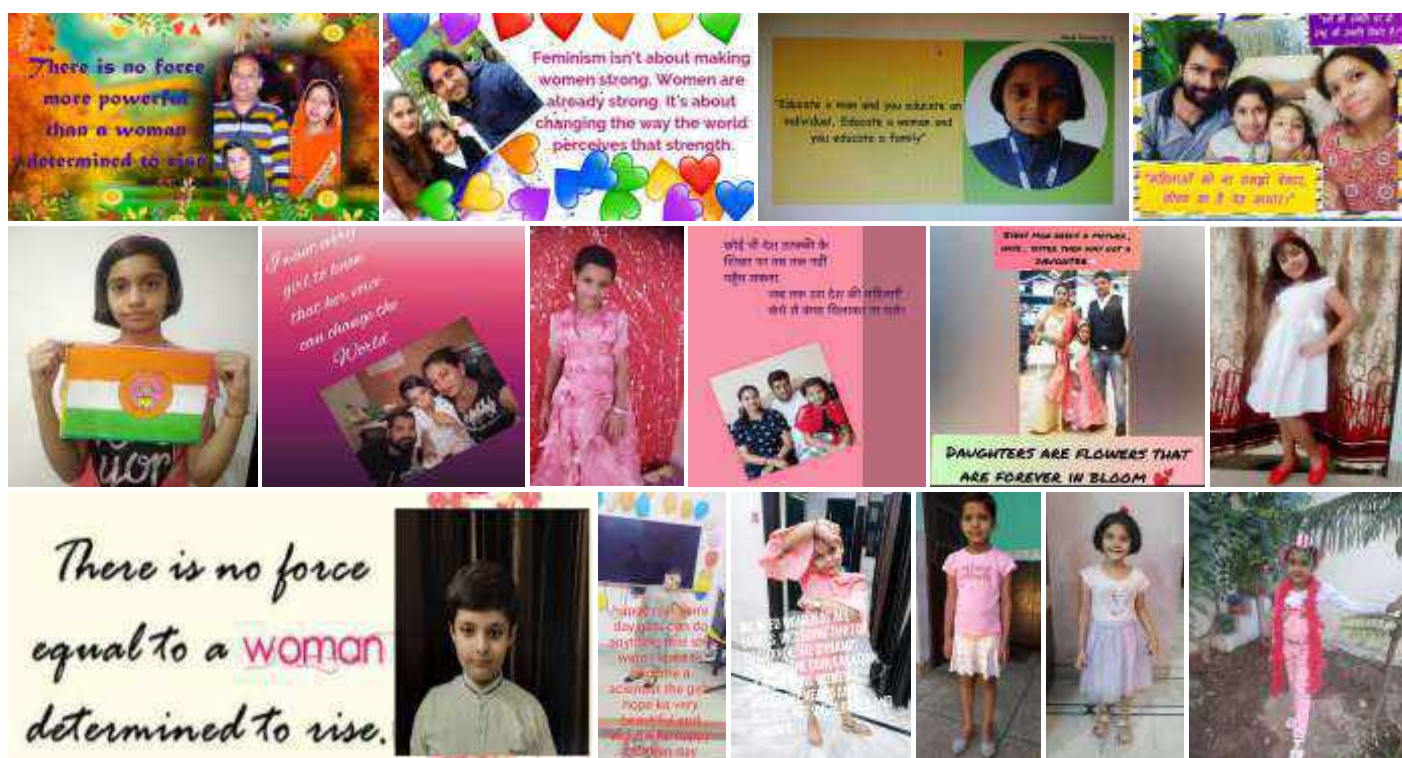
9 October 2020

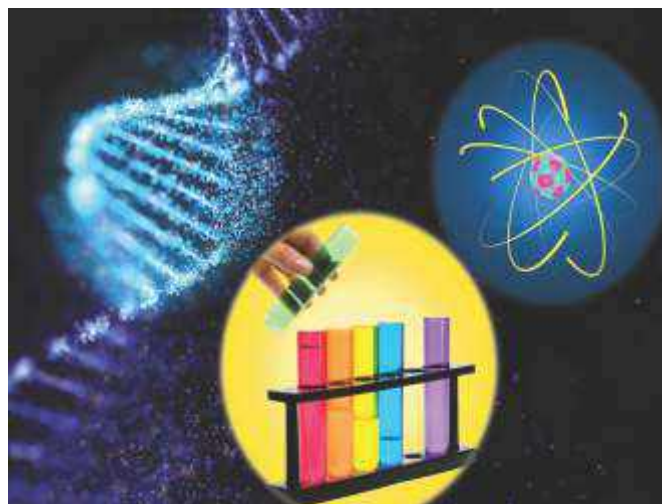

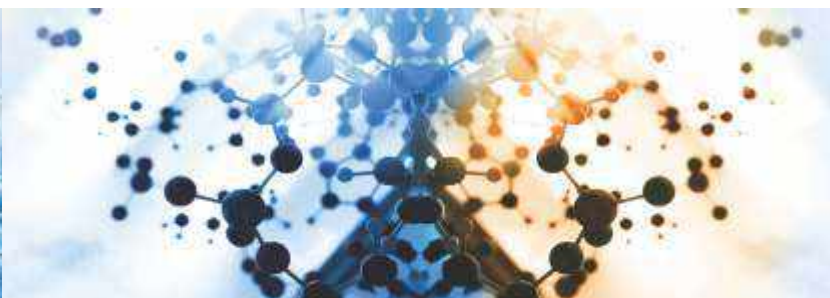

How do scientists perform any experiment?

Observation is an important part, in fact it's the first step. For it's observation that causes you to wonder why earthworms do, what they do and how clouds form in the sky?

Then comes hypothesis. Your hypothesis is the "best guess" based on what you know about how things work.

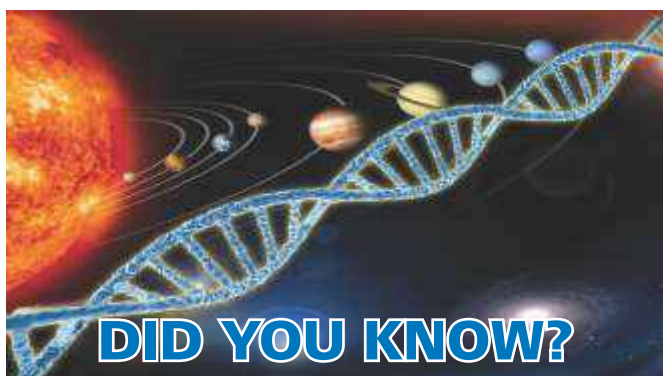
Experimentation lets you test the hypothesis you've made, to see if your best guess can make progress. Recording your data is very important. So, you can analyse the results, record them and others can repeat what you have done.

## BIOGRAPHY: ANDREA M. GHEZ



Andrea Ghez was born in Chicago in 1965. Like many young girls, she wanted to grow up to be a ballerina. The moon landings changed her focus from ballerina to become the first female astronaut and set her on her path to become an astrophysicist. Her studies (undergraduate) began in Mathematics and shifted to Physics during her early years at MIT. In 1987, Ms. Ghez graduated from Massachusetts Institute of Technology with a BS in Physics. From there, she went on to get her PhD from the California Institute of Technology in 1992. While a doctoral student at Caltech, Ms. Ghez convinced her adviser to allow her to teach undergraduate course in Physics. Her argument was that there was a



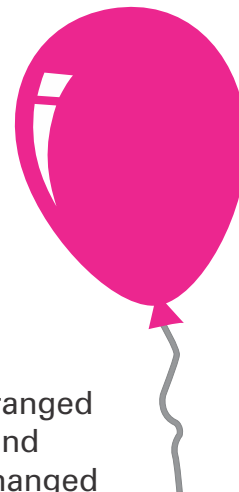
need for female role model in teaching that would encourage young women to pursue science degrees. She received the 'Caltech Teaching Award' for her efforts. In 1994, she joined the teaching staff at UCLA and is now the head of the UCLA Galactic Centre Group.

Ms. Ghez is known for her study of star formation and black holes. While studying as a doctoral student at Caltech, she discovered that most stars are formed in pairs and that most systems have two suns not just one like ours. Her fascination with black holes has been a focal point for her research. Working with a teacher at UCLA, she was able to use special optics to look into the centre of milky way and observed the invisible existence of black hole. Ms. Ghez is currently working to test the theory of general relativity with relationship to black holes.

## TRACKING THE JOURNEY OF URANIUM CUBE

The cover story of Physics Today, May issue includes Hitler, Heisenberg and a missing haul of uranium that was supposed to fuel a nuclear reactor for Nazi Germany. The intrigue began in 2013 when University of Maryland Physicist Timothy Koeth received a small, heavy cube along with the message "Taken from the reactor that Hitler tried to build. Gift of Ninninger". Since then Koeth and his colleague Miriam Hiebert investigated the object, a five pound block of uranium and its origins. They learned that the cube was one of 664 produced by three groups of nuclear physicists in Hitler's Germany, including one led by Werner Heisenberg. The plan was to develop a self-sustaining nuclear reactor and the plan might have succeeded had the three groups better pooled their resources. After the war, American officials also recovered some of the cubes, which the German



researchers had hastily buried in a field and brought them back to the US. Today the whereabouts of most of those cubes is a mystery.

# SCREW GAUGE



Screw Gauge is a mechanical tool which facilitates measuring diameter or radius or thickness of a thin wire or thickness of a thin metal sheet with utmost accuracy. This tool consists of a U shaped frame and a spindle attached to the thimble. There are two scales known as Pitch Scale which is basically a main scale and is engraved on the barrel with vertical lines. Other one is Circular Scale which is engraved horizontally on the thimble. Pitch scale measures the distance in millimeter (mm) travelled by the spindle per revolution. Screw Gauge is more accurate and precise as compared to Vernier Caliper Scale.

The plane surface near the stud is stationary and is known as Anvil which is immovable and attached with the U-shaped frame. When the Anvil and spindle are in contact, the zero of the Pitch Scale must coincide with zero of the Circular Scale. As Anvil is fixed, therefore, it is the most appropriate to place the object whose thickness to be measured near Anvil. At the same time cylindrical thimble needs to be rotated clockwise. This act will make the spindle part move forward towards the Anvil.

Keep rotating the thimble such that spindle reaches the object which was placed near the Anvil. Ratchet is used which checks three times once the precise movement of spindle is done. This position can be locked using the lock knob positioned near the spindle. Then both the Pitch Scale and Circular Scale should be read out.

The final calculation will be as following:

$$\text{Pitch} = \frac{\text{Distance travelled by Screw}}{\text{No. of Rotations}}$$

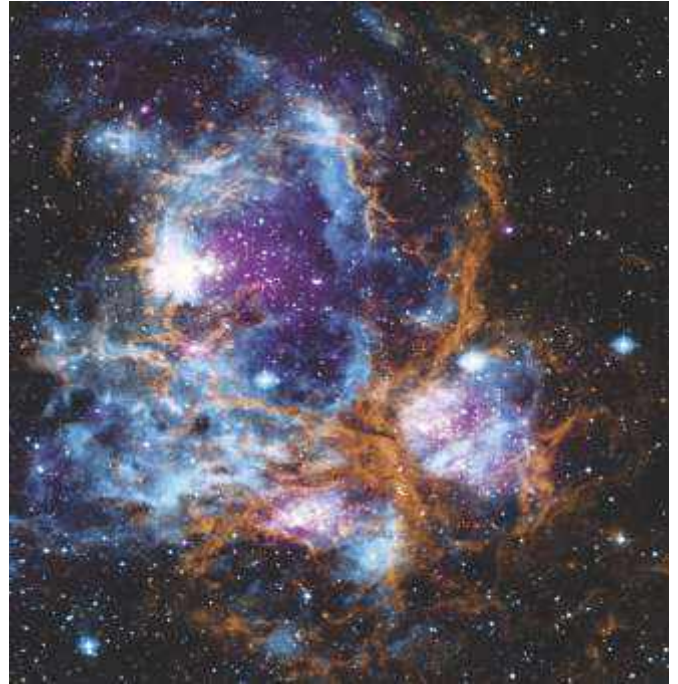

# NASA'S TESS CREATES A COSMIC VISTA OF THE NORTHERN SKY



Familiar stars shine, nebulae glow, and nearby galaxies tantalize in a new panorama of the northern sky assembled from 208 pictures captured by NASA's Transiting Exoplanet Survey Satellite (TESS). The planet hunter imaged about 75% of the sky in a two-year long survey and is still going strong.

TESS has discovered 74 exoplanets, or worlds beyond our solar system. Astronomers are sifting through some 1,200 additional exoplanet candidates, where potential new worlds await confirmation. More than 600 of these candidates lie in the northern sky.

TESS locates planets by simultaneously monitoring many stars over large regions of the sky and watching for tiny changes in their brightness. When a planet passes in front of its host star from our perspective, it blocks some of the stars light, causing it to temporarily dim. This event is called a transit, and it repeats with every orbit of the planet around the star. This technique has proven to be the most successful planet finding strategy so far, accounting for about three quarters of the nearly 4300 exoplanets now known. The data collected also allow for the study of other phenomena such as stellar variations and supernova explosions in unprecedented detail

# COSMIC DUST



Cosmic dust, also called extraterrestrial dust or Space Dust, is the dust which exists in outer space, or has fallen on earth. Most cosmic dust particles measure between a few molecules and 0.1mm (100 micrometer). Larger particles are called Meteoroids. Cosmic dust can be further distinguished by its astronomical location: Intergalactic dust, interstellar dust, interplanetary dust (such as in the zodiacal cloud) and circumplanetary dust (such as in a planetary ring).

In the Solar System, Interplanetary Dust causes the Zodiacal light. Solar System dust includes comet dust, asteroidal dust, dust from the Kuiper belt and interstellar dust passing through the solar system. Thousands of tons of cosmic dust are estimated to reach the earth's surface every year, with most grains having a mass between  $10^{-16}$  kg (0.1pg) and  $10^{-4}$  kg (.100mg). The density of the dust cloud through which earth is travelling is approximately  $10^{-6}$  dust grains/m<sup>3</sup>.

Cosmic dust contains some complex organic compounds Comorphous organic solids with a mixed aromatic that could be created naturally and rapidly, by stars. A smaller fraction of dust in space is 'Stardust' consisting of larger refractory minerals that condensed as matter left by star. Interstellar dust particles were collected by the Stardust spacecraft and samples were returned to earth in 2006.

# NOBEL PRIZE IN PHYSICS FOR DISCOVERIES ON BLACK HOLES



The 2020 Nobel Prize in Physics was awarded with one half to Roger Penrose and the other half jointly to Reinhard Genzel and Andrea Ghez Briton, Roger Penrose received half of the prize for the discoveries of black hole formation.

Black holes have long been considered as the Milky Way's darkest secrets. A black hole is a place in space where gravity pulls so much that even light can't get out. Scientists say the smallest black holes are as small as just one atom. The largest black holes are called "supermassive" and have masses that are more than 1 million suns together.

Black holes form when matter or energy is packed together densely enough. To form a black hole, earth would have to shrink into a sphere smaller than a pingpong ball.

Black holes really represent the breakdown of our physical understanding of the laws of Physics.

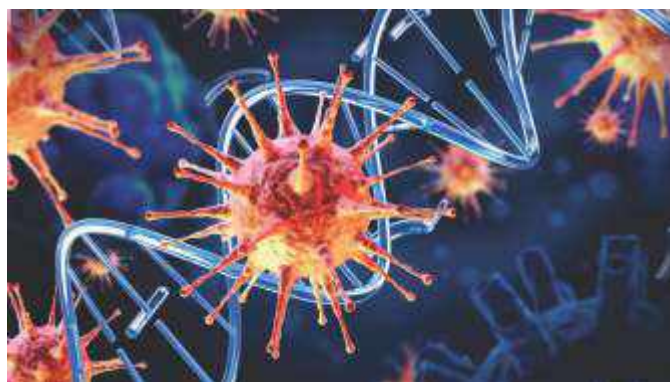
But one of the things that the work from home has done is that it has shown that working from home doesn't mean you're less committed to the work part and more so to the home part.

# Goods & Services Tax



Goods and Service Tax (GST) refers to an indirect tax. The implementation of this tax is in India. The collection of this tax takes place from the point of consumption. This is contrast to collection from the point of origin like previous taxes. Furthermore, this tax's imposition is at every step in the production process. The refund is for all the parties in the various stages of production. Also, GST includes almost all indirect taxes.

Explanation of GST: First of all, GST is a simple and single tax system. The imposition of this tax takes place jointly by the center and the state. Furthermore, the imposition happens with the recommendation of a federal council. In GST, the goods and services are divided into five different tax slabs. This is for the purpose of the tax collection. Above all, the tax slabs are 0%, 5%, 12%, 18% 28%. Also petroleum products,

alcoholic drinks and electricity do not come under GST. Rough, precious and semi precious stones carry a special rate of 0.25%. Gold also carries a special rate of 3%.

GST certainly subsumed several taxes and levels. These includes central excise duty services tax and addition custom duty. Furthermore, state level VAT, surcharges and Octroi also come under GST.

The GST regime has done away with levies. Earlier these levies were applicable to inter-state transportation of goods. Most noteworthy, the application of GST is on all transactions. These transactions are sale, purchase, lease, import and transfer.

## Fiscal Reforms (Since 1991) in India

Fiscal reforms relate to revenue and expenditure of the government. Tax reforms are the principal component of fiscal reforms. Broadly, taxes are classified as:

i) Direct taxes

ii) Indirect taxes

Direct taxes are those taxes, the burden of which cannot be shifted onto others. Example: Income tax, Wealth tax.

Indirect taxes are those taxes, the burden of which can be shifted onto others. Examples: GST (Goods and Services Tax), Custom duty.

One who pays such tax can shift the burden of this tax onto the final buyers of the goods by adding the tax amount to the basic price of goods sold. Prior to liberalisation, tax structure



in the country has been highly complex and evasive. Fearing a heavy burden of taxation, people would often evade taxes.

FII refers to investment in Indian companies (by way of their purchasing equity of shares) by the foreign banking and non-banking institutions. It does involve any kind of direct control on the management of the Indian companies where investment is made. FII unlike FDI, is simply an investment in the stock market in India by the foreign banking and non-banking institutions.

Partial convertibility refers to the sale & purchase of foreign currency (for foreign transaction) at the market price.

In order to encourage competitions, tariff barriers have been withdrawn on most goods traded between India & the rest of the world.

Since 2001, the quantitative restrictions on all import items have been totally withdrawn. This is in conformity with India's commitment to the WTO.

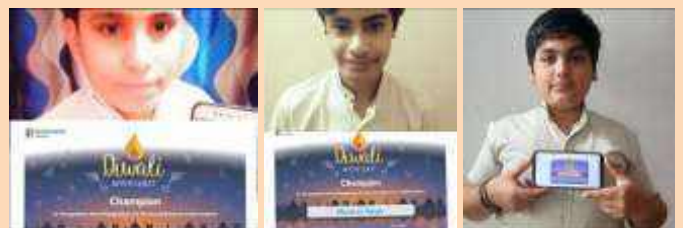

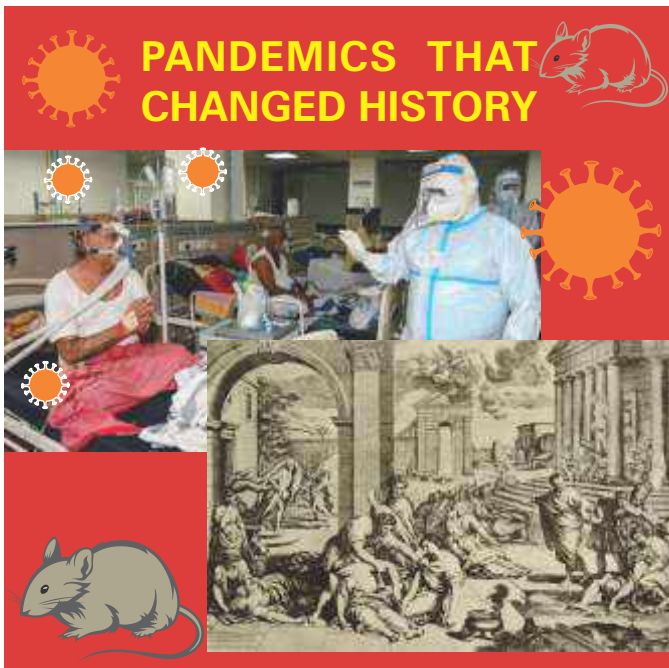
## KHWAJA KHIZR TOMB OF SONIPAT



Khwaja Khizr Tomb is a maqbara located at Jatwara, Sonipat (NCR), India. It was built by Ibrahim Lodi, the last ruler of Lodi dynasty, in the memory of Khwaja Khizr, the son of Darya Khan, during the period 1522-1524 AD. The beautiful tomb was built over the dead remains of Khwaja Khizr who rose to prominence during the reign of Ibrahim Lodi (1517-1526 AD). The Tomb is among the very few monuments where 'Kankar' blocks have been used along with red sandstone. Standing on a high platform and reinforced with square protection at the corners, the tomb is approachable through wide stairs wading to its gateway. The gateway consists of two arched openings at the terminal end of central passage having a facade decorated with designs expected in blue, yellow, green and dull red colours.

1720- Plague; 1820 - Cholera outbreak; 1920- Spanish flu; 2020 - Chinese corona virus. What's happening? There is a theory that every 100 years, a pandemic happens. At first glance, nothing seems strange, but the accuracy with which these events take place is scary.

- Plague 1720-1722 - An infectious fever caused by a bacterium transmitted from rodents to human by the bite of infected fleas. This great plague of Marseille, killed as many as 1,26,000 people in Southern France.
- Cholera 1817-1824 - The 1st Cholera pandemic occurred near the city of Calcutta and spread throughout south & southeast of Asia. And this pandemic has killed about 100,000 people.

## RURAL DEVELOPMENT IN INDIA

The concept of rural development is quite comprehensive and extensive. G. Shah defines rural development as “the development of rural areas, often rural development has meant the extension of irrigation facilities, expansion of electricity, improvement in the techniques of cultivation, construction of school building and provision of educational facilities, health care etc.”

This is considered to be a top-sided view of understanding rural development. This development signifies a complex and long term process involving fundamental transformation of rural society both at social & economic levels. It represents planned programmes to improve the quality of life-style of the ruralities.

### Components of Rural Development:

Rural development entails some components. They are as follows:

- 1) Rural development seeks to transform all the sectors of rural economy - the primary sector, the secondary sector and the tertiary sector.
- 2) It is concerned with improvement of the standard of living of the ruralities through the provision of health and medical facilities, employment opportunities including vocational training, educational facilities, etc.

3) It brings about significant improvement in the socio-economic conditions of the scheduled castes, scheduled tribes, the landless agricultural labourers and the marginal and small farmers.

### Integrated Rural Development:

It is claimed that the concept of integrated rural development was originally propounded by the World Bank. In India, the concept was put forward in the year 1976 at the All India Science Congress by C. Subramanyam, then finance minister of India.

He holds the view that the use of natural resource is possible only through the application of science and technology. Further, proper application of science and technology results in the fulfilment of basic social needs.

The concept of integrated rural development addresses itself to various rural problems like widespread poverty, illiteracy, unemployment, poor health care, etc. It signifies that various facts of rural development are integrally connected.
